For example, you could ask:

“Summarise this five-page report into one page using simple language and bullet points.”

However, if you're making an important decision, it's still good practice to read the original document as well.

 **Builder's Tip:** Use summaries to understand the main ideas quickly, then read the full document if you need a deeper understanding.

Chapter 6 — Asking Better Questions

The quality of AI's answers depends on the quality of the questions you ask.

This is often called prompting.

The clearer your prompt, the more useful the response is likely to be.

Instead of asking:

“Tell me about project management.”

Try asking:

“Explain the basics of project management for someone starting their first office job. Include the key stages, common terminology, and practical examples.”

The second prompt provides context, making it easier for AI to deliver a useful answer.

Good prompts often include:

- The topic.
- The level of detail.
- Who the information is for.
- The format you want.
- Any specific questions you want answered.

Asking follow-up questions is equally important.

If you don't understand part of an answer, simply ask AI to explain it in a different way.



Builder's Tip: *Think of AI as a conversation rather than a search engine. Keep asking questions until the explanation makes sense to you.*

Chapter 7 — Common Mistakes to Avoid

AI is an excellent research assistant, but it should be used thoughtfully.

Here are some common mistakes to avoid.

Accepting Every Answer as Fact

AI can occasionally make mistakes or provide outdated information. Always verify important facts using trusted sources.

Researching Only One Viewpoint

Try asking AI to explain different perspectives so you develop a balanced understanding.

Asking Questions That Are Too Vague

General questions often produce general answers. Adding context usually results in much better information.

Stopping at the First Answer

One of AI's greatest strengths is conversation. Ask follow-up questions to explore a topic more deeply.

Forgetting to Think Critically

AI helps organise information. It doesn't replace your own judgement, experience, or decision-making.

Learn a New Skill

“Teach me the basics of project management in ten simple lessons, starting with the most important concepts.”

Research a Product

“Compare the top five robot vacuum cleaners available in the UK. Include their key features, strengths, weaknesses, and who each model is best suited for.”

Create Study Notes

“Turn this chapter into easy-to-read study notes using headings, bullet points, and a short summary at the end.”

Explain Technical Language

“Explain these technical terms in plain English with simple examples that a beginner would understand.”

Generate Quiz Questions

“Create ten multiple-choice questions based on this topic to help me test my understanding.”



Builder's Tip: AI is at its best when you treat it like a tutor. Ask follow-up questions, request examples, and don't be afraid to ask for a simpler explanation if something isn't clear.
